

Eligibility Requirements

SHARE Head Start

- Proof of income from previous year or previous 12 months
- Proof of Birth
- SC Certificate of Immunization
- If applicable, documentation of diagnosed disability

Energy/Emergency Services (LIHEAP, GEAP)

- Proof of household income for the past 30 days (including the date of application)
- South Carolina Photo ID
- Social security card for each member of the household
- Current bill
- Disconnect notice if one has been issued/Eviction notice

Case Management

- Proof of household income for the past 30 days (including the date of application)
- South Carolina Photo ID

LADDER

- Live in Greenville County
- Earning less than 80% of Greenville County's median family income
- 18 years old or older

Circles

- Be an individual or family in poverty
- Live in Greenville County
- Commit for a minimum of 18 months

Homeless Services

- Must be homeless and referred by the Continuum of Care Coordinated Entry System in Greenville, Anderson, Pickens or Oconee Counties

Housing Repair

- Deed must be in homeowner's name
- Income below 50% of median income
- Income documentation within the past six months

Youth Leadership Development

- Must be at or below 125% of the Federal Poverty Level
- Must be in middle school or high school

Each of our programs is designed to help impoverished people rise from their circumstances and never return to them. We strive to improve the community by providing for and empowering the minds of low-income families and individuals. What We Do

We have a variety of programs that offer solutions to problems many in our community must face on a daily basis.

Head Start

Head Start offers numerous resources for children from birth to age five, as well as for expectant mothers. This program provides high-quality education, health and nutrition assistance, family engagement courses and social services to prepare children and families for success in the public school system.

Energy/Emergency Services

Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)

SHARE's LIHEAP Program is designed to assist low-income households, at or below 150% of the federal poverty guidelines, pay the price of home energy, defined as residential heating and cooling, and to increase energy self-sufficiency; thereby reducing the vulnerability resulting from energy needs.

GEAP

Housing Services provides emergency interventions to prevent homelessness. Services include direct economic assistance, financial counseling, and linkages to other service providers.

Case Management

Participants in this program have access to individualized multifaceted services designed to remove barriers to sustained employment and economic stability.

LADDER

This comprehensive program provides professional job training designed to enhance basic skills and equip participants for the workforce.

Circles

Circles is designed to assist individuals and families who want to move out of poverty and make significant life changes by equipping and empowering them to move forward while being surrounded by a supportive team.

Homeless Services

This program provides rapid rehousing and transitional housing for people who are homeless. They must be referred by the Continuum of Care's Coordinated Entry System in Greenville, Anderson, Pickens and Oconee Counties.

Housing Repair

This service gives us the ability to complete health-and safety-related repairs on homes owned by low-income residents in Greenville, Anderson, Pickens and Oconee Counties.

Youth Leadership

Youth leadership allows middle and high school students to have new educational opportunities that help them improve academically, socially and behaviorally.
